HIGHWAY CLEAN-UP

Computers for Schools

Our club continues to support Computers for Schools by delivering newly refurbished computers to various schools and picking up used computers from donating businesses and government. Bill Butt has contributed 1250 volunteer hours this year to this project.

Work Shop Projects & Activities

Janeway Memory Boxes

Every year there are a number of new born babies that pass away. This is very tragic for the parents and the nurses, at the hospital, try to help by giving them items belonging to the babies such as their small blanket. The wished Nurses to have something appropriate to place these articles in, and that would serve as a keepsake, that they could give to the parents. Small Memory Boxes produced by the Work Shop out of pine has filled this need and every year 30 to forty are produced. They are lined with material by the Craft Room and a picture is etched on the wood cover by a craftsperson in Torbay.

Autism "Shamrock Farm" Deck

In the spring 10 Pioneers from the Work Shop spent over 300 volunteer hours building a deck at the rear of the main building. The deck is 20ft. X 60ft. and will be used for various activities related to the programs to help Austic Children. This was part of a partnership agreement we have with the Autism Society in which we agreed to provide a Green house (completed last fall) and 500 volunteer hours.

Max Simms Camp

In June 5 Pioneers from the Work Shop spent a week at the max Simms Camp for Challenged Children. This was the 11th year that our club has contributed their labor and financial support to improving the physical condition of the fatalities. The work this year involved retiling bathrooms, providing

emergency lighting and a swing at the swimming pool.

Glen Brook Lodge Seniors Home

In our continuing support of the Glen Brook lodge 10 lawn chairs were constructed so residents could enjoy the summer. This fall a sun shade will be we constructed over a patio we built some years ago.
